Strengthening Home-School Partnership

7. As we navigate an increasingly complex and fragile environment, I would like to reiterate the school's commitment to working with you to provide your children with meaningful, grounded learning experiences.

8. In addition to joining our Parent Support Group (PSG), I would like to encourage you to take a greater interest in your child's daily experience and online habits. Parents are our children's first and most important teachers.

9. I would like to encourage you to adopt three practices at home:
- First, to ask your child about what questions he/she asked in school today or questions they'd like to ask but didn't get a chance to. This question avoids the typical and perfunctory question – "How's your day?", which often elicits a monosyllabic answer.
 - With the revised device lock out timing for all student learning devices, require your children to place all their devices outside their rooms. This would help with sleep hygiene.
 - Check your children's phones for inappropriate interactions regularly. In this case, we are particularly concerned about their online interactions, particularly with people that they do not meet in person.

I have informed students about paras 9b and 9c and that we do this out of love and concern for their wellbeing.

10. If you require, please bring matters of concern to us as soon as possible. Our staff email directory is available via the school's website. Communication via email is still the preferred and most expedient mode of communication. My colleagues may share their personal contact information with you, although it is highly discouraged for general correspondence. This is usually done for prompt communication during emergencies.

11. Regular attendance is crucial in ensuring our students can fully experience the learning that has been planned for them. I ask for your support and assistance in ensuring that your child leaves home and reach school on time. School starts at 0730hrs every day except Wednesdays. I would encourage every student to be in school at least 15 minutes before the start of school to settle down and prepare for the day.





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Updates on the Canteen

12. I'm glad to welcome Madam Lieu back after a period of recuperation. Mdm Lieu cooks a hearty selection of noodles, including Laksa and Lor Mee, which are enjoyed by staff and students alike. As of 1 Jan 2026, seven out of eight stalls are operating, which caters sufficiently to the nutritional needs of our students.

13. We have previously opened applications twice for the remaining non-halal cooked food stall but have received no responses. If you or someone you know may be interested in operating a stall, please contact Ms Soo Shio Leng, our Admin Manager, for more details.

14. Our canteen vendors are an integral part of our school community. Many have formed very deep relationships with our students over the years. However, most of them are in their late 50s and early 60s. From time to time, they may require a period of absence for medical reasons. The school will ensure that adequate measures are in place when this happens. I seek your understanding that while this will be infrequent and periodic, there will be some adjustments to be made during these periods.

Looking ahead to 2026

15. I was looking at the school calendar at the end of last year and found myself panting just by looking at the pace and number of events planned for this year. It may be a sign of age that each year seem to pass more quickly than the previous year. But 2026 is setting itself up to be an exciting year for the school and students.

16. Thank you from the bottom of my heart for continuing to trust and partner us in your child's growth and development. We do not take this responsibility lightly.
